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PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It has been an honour to lead this organisation for another season. We have delivered what I believe to be another successful season of cricket in Orange, and one that also saw some success for us on the representative front.

From a facilities perspective, we are edging closer to being able to use the new fields at the sporting precinct. At the end of last season, I was hopeful that we might have been on them in the season just gone, but that wasn't to be the case. There is still supporting infrastructure to be built, but the fields themselves would be all but ready.

We also have been working with the juniors to come up with a way to widen the pitch at Brendon Sturgeon Oval whilst still maintaining the clearances required for rugby league.

We were successful in obtaining a grant from Council to help with this project, and when we add that to funds from ourselves and the junior association we expect to be able to replace the pitch and buy a cover that can be put over it during the winter to protect winter sports participants. Thank you to Adrian Lee for this work on this one. Works are expected to start in September once winter sports have finished, and we should be back using that ground hopefully not too far into the new season.

It feels long overdue, but our Premier League side made it to the final of the competition. After winning all 3 of our preliminary round matches, we hosted Bathurst in the Final. Unfortunately we could not repeat our round win over Bathurst in that match. The pleasing thing was how well this team has gelled under the leadership of Tom Belmonte this season on the back of several seasons of improvement, particularly around attitude. The other pleasing thing was that our victory over Bathurst in the round match also secured us the Presidents Cup Trophy, which hasn't been played for since 2018-19. It was good to see it back in our trophy cabinet after being elsewhere since 2010.

Our Western Zone Cup side also enjoyed a successful season, under the leadership of Harry Grindle. We focussed on providing opportunities to youth and managed to go one better than last season to win that title. Interestingly, Toby Middleton is the only player to have played in both finals.

The boys had to make two trips to Mudgee to win the trophy and I think they would have learned a lot from their first visit, where they were in a position to win that match but couldn't quite put Mudgee away. Second time around they did just that and brought the trophy back to Orange. We will continue to provide opportunities for youth in this team.

CYMS' English import, George Fisher was our sole representative in the Western Zone team, but that is by no means a measure of our performances on the representative front. We had a number of Central West representatives in Fisher, Tom Belmonte, Rory Daburger and Tom Blowes. Blowes played his club cricket in Dubbo this season, but still represented Orange and Central West, and most likely would have represented Western Zone again at Opens level had it not been for a scheduling clash between the NSW Country Championships and the Under 19 National Championships where he was representing NSW Country.

Fletcher Byrne was our other male representative at a National Championships level, at the Under 17s in Brisbane. Fletcher was also part of the Western Zone Colts side, as was Blowes. There were a couple of faces familiar to us in the Western Zone Bradman Cup (Under 16) side, in the way of Kinross' Ben Brazier and Billy Baldwinson.

Several ladies from our town represented Western Zone again this season, with Orange product Kira Churchland captain of the women's team that won the Womens Plan B Country Bash. Joining Kira in that team were Amanda Causer, Simran Dhadd, Lucy Mellis, Eloise Fairley and Emma Hughes. Emma, who is originally from Dubbo, played 2nd Grade for CYMS during the season. Kira was again selected in the NSW Country team for the Australia Country Championships and was joined in that team by Emma Hughes.

Simran Dhatt, Lucy Mellis, Holly Reed and Phoebe Johnston were all part of the South West side that competed at the Under 19 Country Championships while Miller Byrne was Orange's sole representative in the Western Zone Under 16 female side.

In our own competitions, congratulations to Orange City on winning both the Second and Third Grade titles, and Orange CYMS who won Fourth Grade. The lower grade T20 competition split into separate 3rd Grade and 4th Grade T20 competitions, with the final for both played at Wade Park. Orange CYMS won their 4th straight McCarthy Cup, and Kinross the Spirit of Cricket trophy again. The question that needs to be posed to clubs, is how do you top the students when it comes to spirit of cricket?

Team numbers were up again in both mens grades and our women's competitions. The womens social cricket competition has started to put pressure on availability of suitable ground's with 17 teams participating this season. The new pitch at Brendon Sturgeon Oval will help to ease that somewhat, and we also used Orange High School for the first time in a very long time (maybe ever?). We are looking at adding a Colts competition next season to help try and attract some of the young men that we lose, back to cricket.

In BOIDC, Orange CYMS played St Pats Old Boys in an absolute thriller of a grand final, in a match that went to the very last over of the match. For the record St Pats got up on First innings, but if there were a few more overs available the result could have easily gone the other way.

We continued to be supported by a number of wonderful sponsors, including Maccas, Burmac Insurance Solutions, Parkview Hotel, Kookaburra and Trussco.

Thank you to Shelvin and the other BurMac Insurance Solutions representatives who attended the Bonnor Cup final again this season. Congratulations to St Pats Old Boys who were too strong for Cavaliers in that match and to Cooper Brien who picked up the double of Player of the Final and Carl Sharpe Medal for the second consecutive year.

I started my cricket administration journey in the club scene so I know how much work goes into keeping a club moving. Whilst things might seem to be just ticking along from the outside, there is always plenty happening in the back room. Thank you to everyone who is a part of that. Your work doesn't go un-noticed. Please continue to do what you do, and continue to bring through the next generation of cricket volunteers and administrators.

Thank you also to my Committee. We continue to strive to improve this Association and the competitions that we run. Pete Jarick hit his 24th season as Secretary which is a truly amazing number and something that no one else has even come close to in our 115 year history. We had David Redden join us this season after relocating back to the area, with Matt Tabbernor, Dave Neil, Liam Dillon and Bill McKay returning before Bill resigned his position in November.

With Easter the weekend after our Grand Final, we decided to move the presentation night to the Thursday before the Grand Final. With the threat of weather we were forced to move it from an outdoor venue to the Trimmer Pavilion at the last minute, and whilst not as good as the previous season at the Parkview, it was important to be able to gather to present awards to our high achievers from the season. I thank everyone who did attend the night, and we will have a better plan B should a similar situation arise next season.

On that note, congratulations to all of our season award winners including those who won BOIDC awards and/or were named in the BOIDC team of the season.

I will wrap up my report here, and thank the members for entrusting me with the responsibility of leading this organisation for another term.

Round 1 v Dubbo at Wade Park – 19/10/25

With a new-look side under the leadership of Tom Belmonte, we went into Sunday's Western Premier League first round match against Dubbo looking to make a positive start to our representative season.

Winning the toss, we elected to bat against Dubbo, on a Wade Park track that had yielded over 500 runs the day before. With Belmonte and CYMS team-mate George Fisher opening the batting, we got off to a flying start putting 60 on the board before Belmonte was bowled by Dubbo skipper, Marty Jeffrey. Belmonte's entertaining innings of 41 off 27 balls included 4 sixes, one onto the Cricket Centre roof in the first over that required the ball to be replaced and other monster a few overs later that landed on the roof of the grandstand.

Cohen Schubert joined Fisher at the crease to push the score along to 105 before Fisher became Jeffrey's second victim after making 54 from 45 deliveries. The Dubbo slow bowlers then started to take away some of our momentum as they slowed the run rate, and even though most of our batters made starts, we started to lose wickets on a more regular basis and were 8/175 in the 38th over when Aditya Adey was joined by Harry Dyer at the crease. The pair then set about putting the finishing touches to our innings, adding 65 at almost a run a ball before Adey was run out in the final over. With the addition of a few more runs, we finished our 50 overs at 9/245.

Our bowlers came out after the lunch break ready for the task at hand. Our opening pair of Ed Morrish and Lachie Wykes made early inroads, as first Ed removed Joey Coughlan and then Lachie bowled Fletcher Hyde to have Dubbo 2/23. With Marty Jeffrey and Charlie Kempston at the crease, the visitors clawed their way back into the match on the back of their 88 run partnership. Tom Blowes then struck a double blow, removing Kempston and then Tom Nelson the very next ball to leave Dubbo 4/111 in the 24th over. Some tight bowling from Hayden Griffith reaped rewards as he had Ben Wheeler out caught. When Blowes struck again to remove Ant Atlee, Orange held the upper hand with Dubbo 6/131.

Dubbo once again looked to build some momentum in their innings with Tom Atlee joining Jeffrey at the crease, but a brilliant piece of fielding from Aditya Adey had Jeffrey short of his

crease on 85, and Dubbo at 7/173, still requiring 73 runs for victory. Adey then removed Ben Knaggs a short while after before Cohen Schubert and Ed Morrish finished off the Dubbo innings to secure our victory by 35 runs, and our first over Dubbo in 8 years. Tom Blowes returned the figures of 3/45 from his 10 overs, while Ed Morrish picked up 2/27 from his 8.5 overs. Lachie Wykes, Hayden Griffith, Aditya Adey and Cohen Schubert each picked up a wicket.

It was a fine team effort, with some strong performances with the bat, a good all round bowling effort backed up by some good catching, with both Tom Blowes and George Fisher taking a couple of outfield catches each.

Round 2 v Parkes at Woodward Oval – 26/10/25

Orange travelled to Parkes' Woodward Oval for the second round of the Western Premier League competition on Sunday. We were greeted by some light rain which hung around for several hours, delaying the start of the match by over 2 hours. When we finally got the covers off, Parkes won the toss and elected to bowl in the match that had been reduced to 37 overs per side.

Our innings got off to a great start with skipper Tom Belmonte hitting a 4 and a 6 off the first 2 legitimate deliveries, with some wides and another 4 later in the over, we had 17 on the board after the first over. Belmonte was out caught in the next over, Cohen Schubert joined George Fisher at the crease with the pair pushing the score along to 86 before Schubert was bowled by Zac Bayliss for 29. Rory Daburger and Fisher took the score along to 2/128 at the drinks break (19 overs). The partnership continued to bloom with the Parkes bowlers struggling to come up with answers. When Daburger was finally dismissed for 65 at the start of the 35th over, our score had progressed to 3-270. Lachie Wykes and then Fletcher Byrne helped add the finishing touches to our innings, as we finished on 5-298. George Fisher carried his bat to finish unbeaten on 154 from only 104 deliveries.

With rain again starting to fall as our innings was coming to its end, the covers went back on over the innings break, with fingers crossed they wouldn't stay on for too long. The showers cleared and play resumed on time and it didn't take long for our bowling attack to click into gear. With Lachie Wykes struggling with his footing, Tom Blowes was introduced into the attack in the 5th over and bowled in tandem with Rory Daburger who opened from the other end to keep the pressure on the Parkes bats. At the end of Daburger's 8 over spell, Parkes had slumped to 6-66 with Rory picking up all 6 wickets to finish with the figures of 6/22. Harry Dyer and Cohen Schubert helped to close out the win, sharing the final 4 wickets between them as Parkes were all out for 79.

Round 3 v Bathurst at Wade Park – 9/11/25

The team made it three wins from 3 matches in the Western Premier League competition after defeating Bathurst by 4 runs on Sunday. The win leaves us on top of the table and with a home final.

After winning the toss and batting, our innings got off to a promising start with 78 runs on the board at the end of the first 10 overs, with only our skipper back in the sheds. Opener George Fisher and Bailey Ferguson put on 53 for the 2nd wicket before Ruben Newton had George Fisher out caught for 32 in the 12th over with our score at 2-87. Cohen Schubert joined Ferguson at the crease and the pair added another 50 to the score before Ferguson was out for 64. The Bathurst bowlers kept things in check for the rest of our innings, with wickets regularly falling before we were finally all out for 251 with a couple of overs to go. Ferguson top scored with 64, while Schubert made 56 and Fisher 32.

At 0-132, Bathurst seemed in control of the match but then things started to slowly turn when Harry Dyer removed Bailey Brien and then Bailey Ferguson bowled Cooper Brien next over to have Bathurst 2-133. Orange started to claw their way back into the match, with some good bowling forcing the required run rate up over 6 runs per over.

The match continued to ebb and flow, but as Bathurst seemed to gain the upper hand once again, Harry Dyer chimed in to take his second wicket, that of Tanvir Singh. The reintroduction into the attack of our opening bowlers paid immediate dividends with Aditya Adey removing centurion Hugh Taylor to swing the momentum slightly back in our favour. At the end of that over, the 44th, Bathurst needed 51 runs to win the match. They took 37 from the next 4 overs to seemingly have control, but Orange hadn't given up.

The second last over of the innings, bowled by Ed Morrish was a big one for us, as Ed had Will Cross caught off his first ball and then bowled Ruben Newton off his last ball, conceding only 2 runs in the process. With Bathurst needing 12 runs from the final over to host the final, Aditya Adey gave the set batter, Blake Kreuzberger, little to hit to close out the match and secure the win.

The win not only secured a home final in the Western Premier League competition, but also won us the Presidents Cup, a Central West Cricket Council trophy that hasn't been played for in 7 years, and one that we haven't won since the 2009-10 season.

Final v Bathurst at Wade Park – 1/2/26

Bathurst skipper Bailey Brien won the toss and elected to bat first in the 2025-26 Western Premier League Final.

Aditya Adey made a couple of important early breakthroughs, dismissing both Brien brothers early before Rory Daburger had Blake Kreuzberger caught to have the visitors 3-50. Harry Dyer had Hugh Taylor caught behind for 42, before Tom Blowes removed Will Cross with the score at 5-97.

Cooper Stephen and Hugh Parsons added 42 to the total before Cohen Schubert picked up Parsons' wicket. Ruben Newton joined Stephen and the pair added another 42 to their team's total before Ollie Brincat dismissed Newton, and then Daburger caught Stephen off his own bowling in the very next over to pick up his second of the innings. Daburger repeated the dose to dismiss Kobe Muir and then took his fourth to end the Bathurst innings on 189.

We made a promising start to the chase, as Tom Belmonte and Geroge Fisher put on 35 for the first wicket before Belmonte fell to Ruben Newton. George Fisher fell in the next over to Blake Kreuzberger to swing the momentum back in Bathurst's favour. Cohen Schubert and Daburger took our score to 64 before Hugh Parsons struck to rove Schubert. Parsons took his second to dismiss Fletcher Byrne before Kreuzberger took two important wickets in Daburger and Tom Blowes to give his side the ascendancy with our score at 6-96. Our lower order dug in, trying to form partnerships, but with a ballooning run rate we were eventually bowled out for 137 in the 42nd over, to fall short of victory in our first ever trip to the Premier League Final.

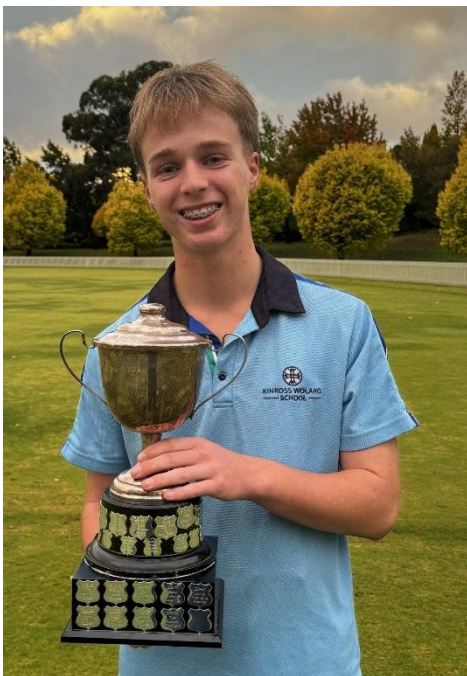
